October 15, 2010 (Curtis, NE) NCTA lost their game on October 12 to the Club House from North Platte by the scores of 23-25, 14-25, 25-21 and 21-25. The host Aggies could not overcome their errors with six serve errors and ten serve receive errors. The sixteen points given up in errors loomed large with first and fourth sets being closely contested by a total of six points. Coach Jeremy Sievers said, "I am proud of how we responded and fought back several times tonight from double digit deficits to make the sets close. The thing that is frustrating for us is that we sometimes make mistakes that are just simple mental mistakes and should be cleared up by this time of the year. The girls work hard in practice but sometimes in games we just try to do too much and do not communicate with each other."



NCTA freshmen Edith Nickel of Benedict, Neb., dropped down to 17th place nationally by the USCAA in scoring at 3.585 through forty-one sets. Nickel also dropped down one spot from 10th to 11th place in ace serves but climbed back up one spot to 13th in blocks. Junior Alyssa Montgomery of Jennings, Kan., is now 16th in the nation for services aces with a total of thirty in forty-one sets.
