Goals:

Institutionalize an integrated and systematic planning and assessment protocol measuring attainment of college-wide goals as identified in the college strategic plan.

Characteristics of the assessment protocol:

1. The system is simple, useful and pragmatic.
2. Focuses on student learning outcomes.
3. The process is cyclical and ties into existing evaluation structures.
4. The system utilizes existing assessment practices were feasible.
5. The process influences budgetary priorities.
6. The process is forward-looking and considers emerging trends.
