During the 24-hour day of giving, NCTA ranked 12th out of the 42 groups represented in the total amount given. We had 63 individuals make a contribution to one of three funds that are focused on students. Our total this year was \$17,260. All gifts will make an impact on students in multiple ways.

One option donors had for giving was to the Curtis Aggie NCTA Scholarship Fund. This fund successfully matched the \$1,000 challenge of Steven and Heather Stettner of Palmer, Nebraska. The NCTA Alumni Association created this scholarship years ago to support students whose parents were alumni of UNSTA or NCTA.

A second giving option that was also available was the NCTA Scholarship Fund. The fund also reached the \$1,000 match challenge set forth by Warren and Terri Jo Bek of Ord, Nebraska. Both of these funds will provide scholarships directly to NCTA students for the 2024-25 academic year.

Donors could also choose to support the NCTA fund, which is used to support the greatest needs of the college and students. The money raised this year will go directly to support the Aggie Cupboard. The Aggie Cupboard serves students with personal needs related to food insecurity, personal care products, clothing, or school supplies.

I want to especially thank Rex and Heidi Hansen and the North 40 Chophouse in North Platte for their generous support by providing gift certificates to their restaurant as incentives for larger gifts.
