Q: What year did you graduate from NCTA?

Q: What was a highlight from your program and career at NCTA?

A: A highlight from the Agriculture Education program at NCTA would be getting to be one of the pioneers to start the Ag Ed program and working with Dr. Doug Smith in its launch and creation. I've enjoyed seeing all the students come through the Ag Education program at NCTA.

The biggest highlight of my career at NCTA would be the long-lasting friendships that were made through the rodeo team and on campus.

Q: When did you start teaching?

A: I started teaching at Wisner-Pilger in 2016.
